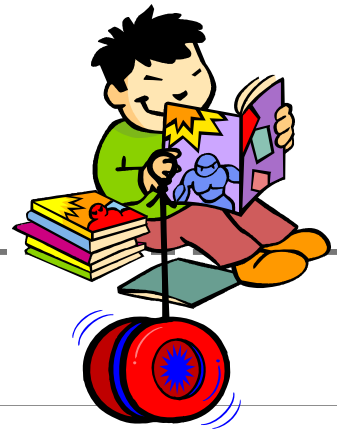

1:30–2:30 p.m.

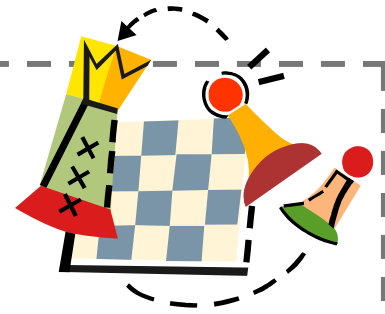

What's New at the Library?

The Youth Services Department has been very busy building new library collections. Here are some things that might interest you.

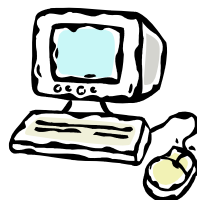
Playaway[®] audiobooks come pre-loaded with a story and packaged so they are ready to play. The small size makes them portable and easy for you to use. Ask a Librarian to show you where to find the Playaways. There are picture book favorites as well as longer books for older readers. All you need for your listening experience are earbuds and a AAA battery that you provide. You'll be so cool listening to your Playaway!

The Library's web site features new products, too. Go to the web site at www.cslibrary.org and look for the "Children's Resources" listing on the left.

Tumblebooks are animated, talking picture books that you can read (or listen to) online. There are also activities and puzzles that are very fun.

World Book offers students two encyclopedias in Spanish. **Gran enciclopedia hispánica** is written all in Spanish. With **Spanish Student Discovery Encyclopedia** you can look up subjects in English but the articles are in Spanish. Look for the World Book link from "Research a Topic" to get to these. Confusing?
