Tickets are required for these performances. Pick them up at the Youth Services Desk.

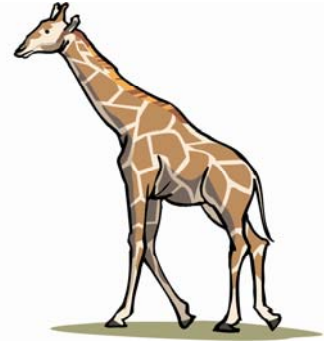
