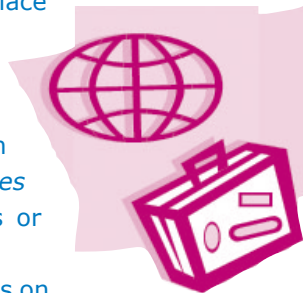

## On the road this summer? Take us along!

Here are just a few of the things the library offers that will help planning and taking that trip just a little easier:

Need maps and information about a place you've never been? Or want to learn the basics of a new language before you leave? *A to Z Maps Online*, *CultureGrams*, and *Global Road Warrior* are great resources to explore when planning your next trip, and *Mango Languages* and *Powerspeak* can help you *parle français* or *habla español*.

Don't forget that the library has audiobooks on CD and Playaways to help you pass the time on those long car and plane rides. You can also download audiobooks to your own iPod, iPhone or other portable device from the Library's OverDrive service.



Remember that no matter where you are the library is just a text away! Text us a question anytime the Library is open. Text **cspl** + **[your question]** to **66746**, and we'll get back to you within minutes. (The service is free though your carrier's standard message rates may apply).

# YOUR LIBRARY AND YOU

## Small group study rooms available

The Library now has three small group study rooms available for patron use.

Group study rooms are available by reservation only.

Patrons must be at least 12 years of age and have a Carol Stream Public Library card. Library card must be presented at time of use.

Rooms can be reserved in one hour increments, and reservations may be made up to 48 hours ahead of time. If there are no other reservations for a room, time may be extended an additional hour (up to three hours).

Group Study Room A has a maximum capacity of six people. Group Study Rooms B and C have a maximum capacity of three people. Study rooms may not be used to conduct business transactions.
