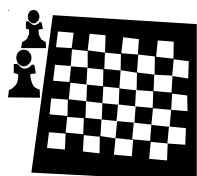

Nominees for the Rebecca Caudill Award are also located in a special area. Ask a Librarian to help you find them. Voters should have read at least three of these books to be eligible for a ballot.
