Audiobook Listeners are “all ears”

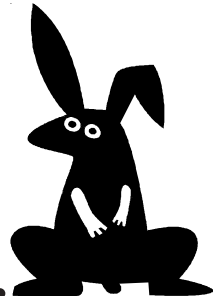
Traveling over spring break? Take along some of these fun titles or ask a Librarian for other selections to enjoy.

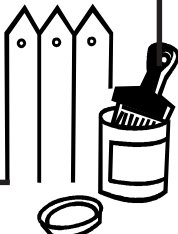
