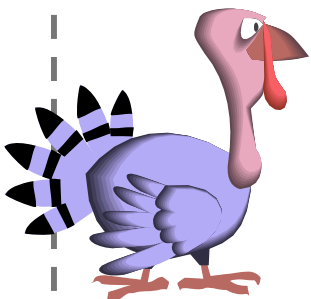
### Bring a Turkey to Dinner!

Thursday, November 20

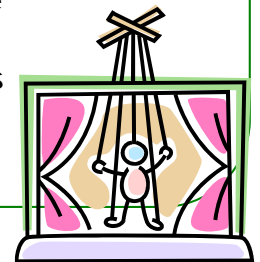
7:00–7:40 p.m.

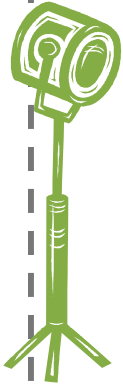
After the program, meet puppeteer Linda Roberts. You can ask questions about how she created the marionettes and adapted the story for this evening's show.
