# A Year in Review

### SUMMER READING

### **Youth Services Program**

The Youth Summer Reading Program had a total of 1,345 participants. 941 children each read 600 minutes or more and earned a book to take home and keep. Together participants reported reading 884,200 minutes of great non-stop reading.

### **Adult Services Program**

The Adult Summer Reading Program had a total of 458 Adult and 45 High School participants.



### **PROGRAMS**

### **Adult Services**

Adult Services offered special programs for Adults and Teens. In the past year, Adult Services had an estimate of 387 Adult and 125 Teen in-person and self-directed Adult programs servicing a total of 8,481 Adults & 2,021 Teens who participated in a variety of engaging activities, including crafts, presentations and hands-on events.

Some notable programs included the Summer High School Volunteer Program where 75 teens created 300 handmade pet blankets & provided more than 500 cat toys to Anderson Humane. Adult Services hosted 100 ESL sessions, partnering with COD & People's Resource Center. The Library also delivered over 2,000 items to our Homebound Patrons, creating a wonderful experience for patrons from the comfort of their homes.



### **Youth Services**

During 2025, Youth Services hosted 726 in-person and selfdirected programs servicing a total of 22,580 patrons.



The Library provided dance and movement programs, book discussions, cooking, science & animal programs for kids and families. Youth Services offered a variety of engaging programs designed for kids to learn, explore, and have fun. Highlights included the Summer Reading Kick-Off, where families enjoyed a day of art activities and a foam party. Other popular events included the DIY Drive-In, Encanto Experience and A Date with Dad, each providing opportunities for creativity, connection and lasting memories.

### **COMMUNITY EVENTS CSPL Blood Drive**

In collaboration with the generous Carol Stream community and Versiti Blood Center, 53 units of blood were donated, aiding 159 patients in need. A heartfelt thanks to all our donors for their unwavering support.



### **DISTRIBUTED CRAFTS & ACTIVITIES**

### CSPL, Spice of the Month & Take & Make Kits

Youth Services Librarians distributed a total of 3,470 CSPL Kits over the past year. In total, Adult Service distributed 600 Spice of the Month Kits, 1,440 High School Take & Makes and 1,350 Adult Take & Makes to Carol Stream patrons this past year.

### **Binge Boxes**

**Adult Services Librarians** produced 200 Adult & High School Binge Boxes with handselected books for patrons. Youth Services Librarians produced over 889 Binge Boxes with hand-picked books, treats and small gifts to brighten readers' days.





