● 2022-A Year in Review

SUMMER READING PROGRAMS

Camp Hiawatha Youth Program

The Youth Summer Reading Program had a total of 1,057 participants. 740 children (70.5%) read 600 minutes and earned a book to take home and keep. Together participants report reading 739,000 minutes, an equivalent of 1.4 years of great non-stop reading.



Camp Hiawatha Adult Program

The Adult Summer Reading Program set a new record for both adults and teens with a total of 630 participants.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Adult Programs

Over the past year, 2,500 adults enjoyed crafts, presentations and hands-on events presented by the Carol Stream Public Library.

ESL Partnership Class

The Library partnered with the College of DuPage to provide English learning classes in which patrons could strengthen their reading, writing, listening and speaking skills.



Lifeways of The Potawatomi

The Library invited Sal Redhawk, a lifelong resident of Illinois and a descendant of the Zapatecan and Chichimecan, to speak about the early lives of the Potawatomi. The presenter displayed Native American artifacts from the 1700s.

Youth Programs

Each Month the Library provided 19 storytimes for children ages 0-5. Additionally, the Library provided dance or movement programs, book discussions, cooking, science and animal programs for kids' enjoyment.



Youth Services presented many special programs for kids to learn and have fun, such as the Library Luau, Unexpected Science and a Stuffie Sleepover. At the Luau, kids followed along with traditional Hawaiian dances while mixing in a bit of freestyle too! During Unexpected Science, kids interacted with the presenter to perform many cool experiments. Stuffie Sleepover was a hit as kids enjoyed storytime and crafts with their favorite stuffed animals.

DISTRIBUTED CRAFTS & ACTIVITIES

CSPL Kits

Youth Services Librarians distributed four CSPL Kits a month over the past year. In total, the librarians distributed 2,000 kits for preschoolers and 2,000 kits for school-age kids. Overall, 4,000 CSPL Kits are distributed annually to Carol Stream patrons.

Binge Boxes

Adult Service Librarians produced 300 Binge Boxes with 1,200 hand-selected books for patrons. Youth Services Librarians produced over 700 Binge Boxes with hand-picked books plus treats and small gifts to brighten readers' day.

by nearly everyone.




